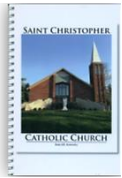


Interested in becoming Catholic? Not sure?

Contact Glory Kramer, who will assist you in asking the right questions. The normal process by which an individual is received into the Catholic Faith is called the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* or RCIA for short, and sessions begin soon. During RCIA, participants journey with others (sponsors, team members, and parish representatives) towards the Sacraments of Initiation through individual study, lectures, group prayer, discussion, and service opportunities. Normally, most people are received into the Church at the Easter Vigil. Inquiry is underway.

DN 7:9-10, 13-14

As I watched:
